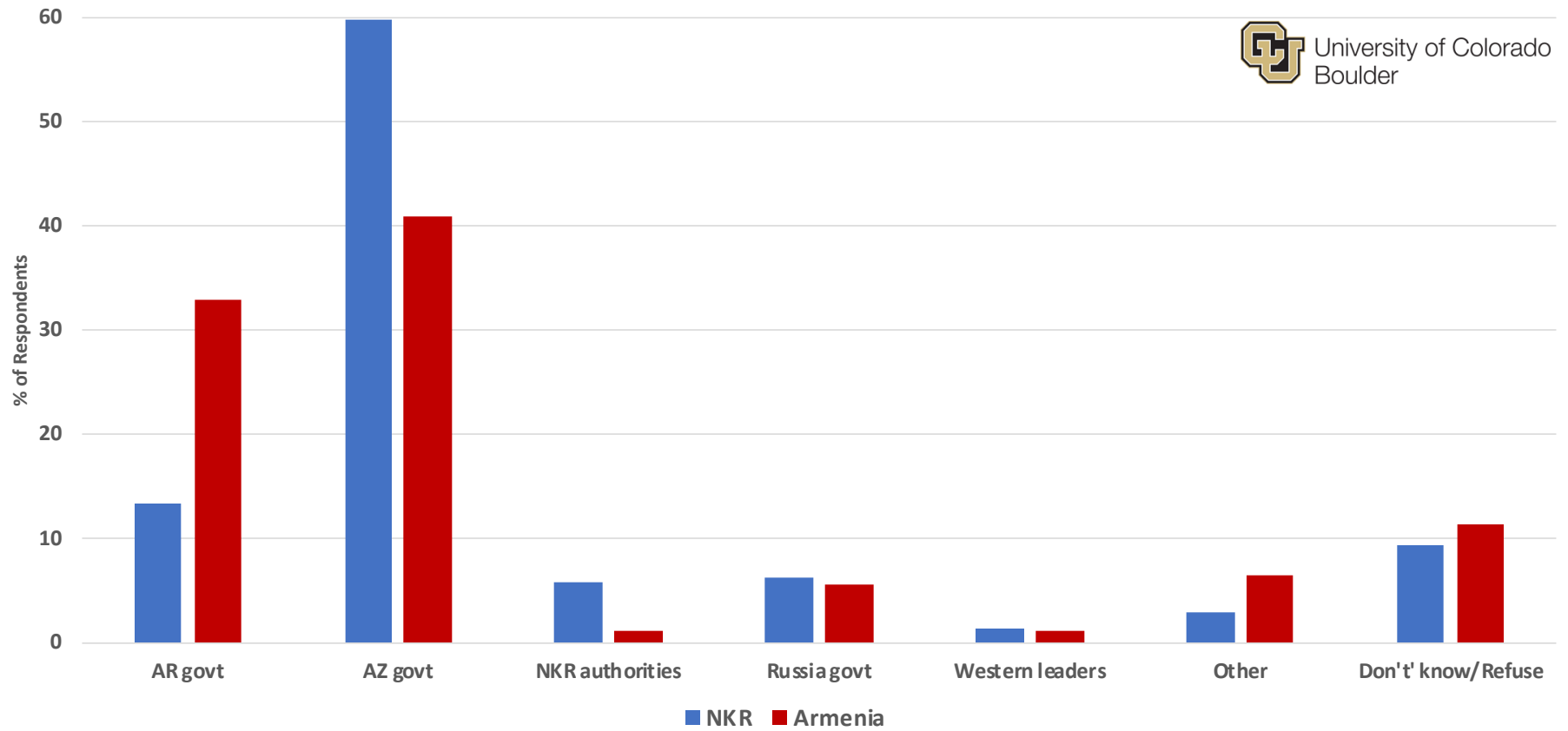
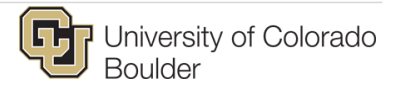

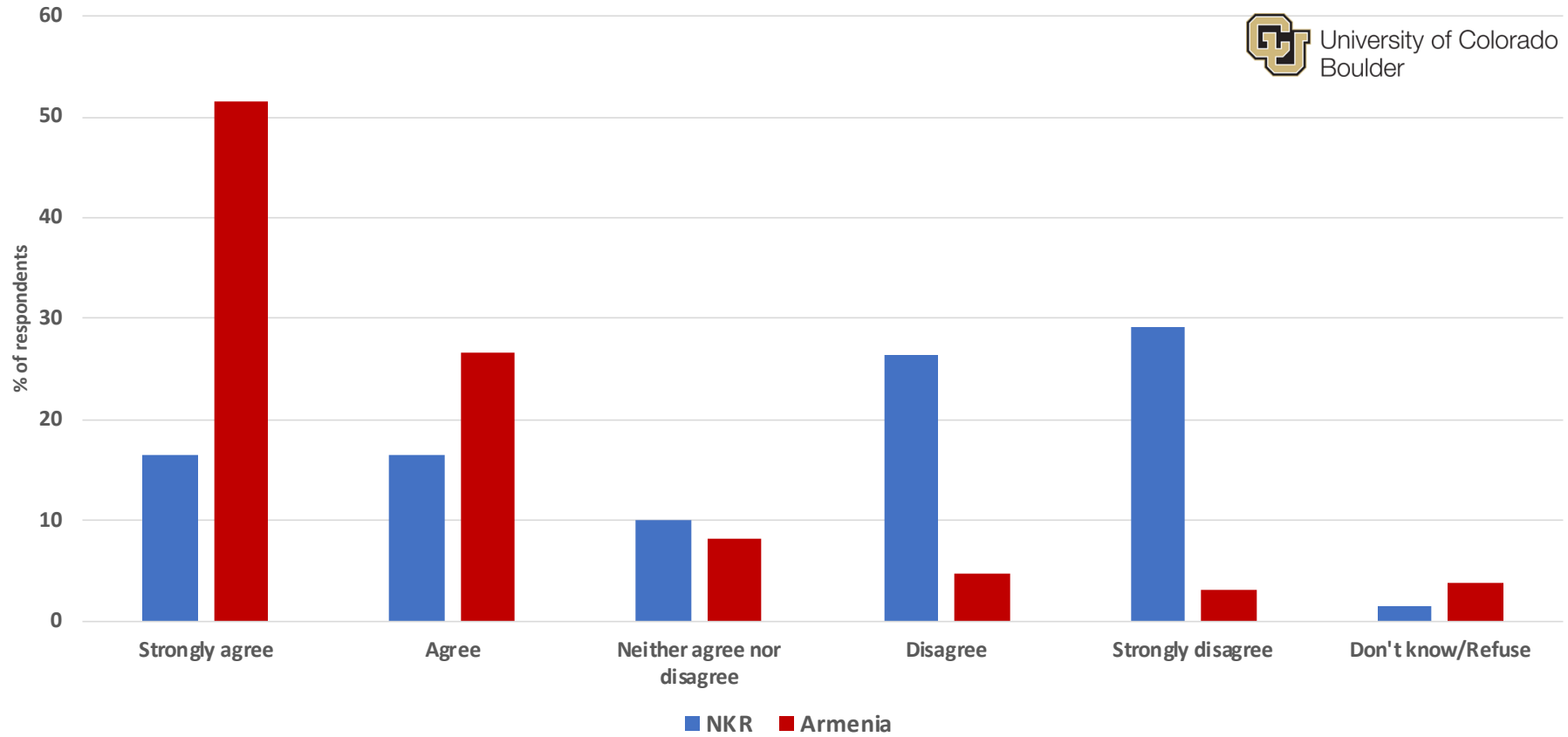
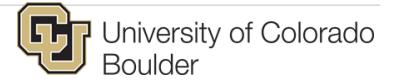

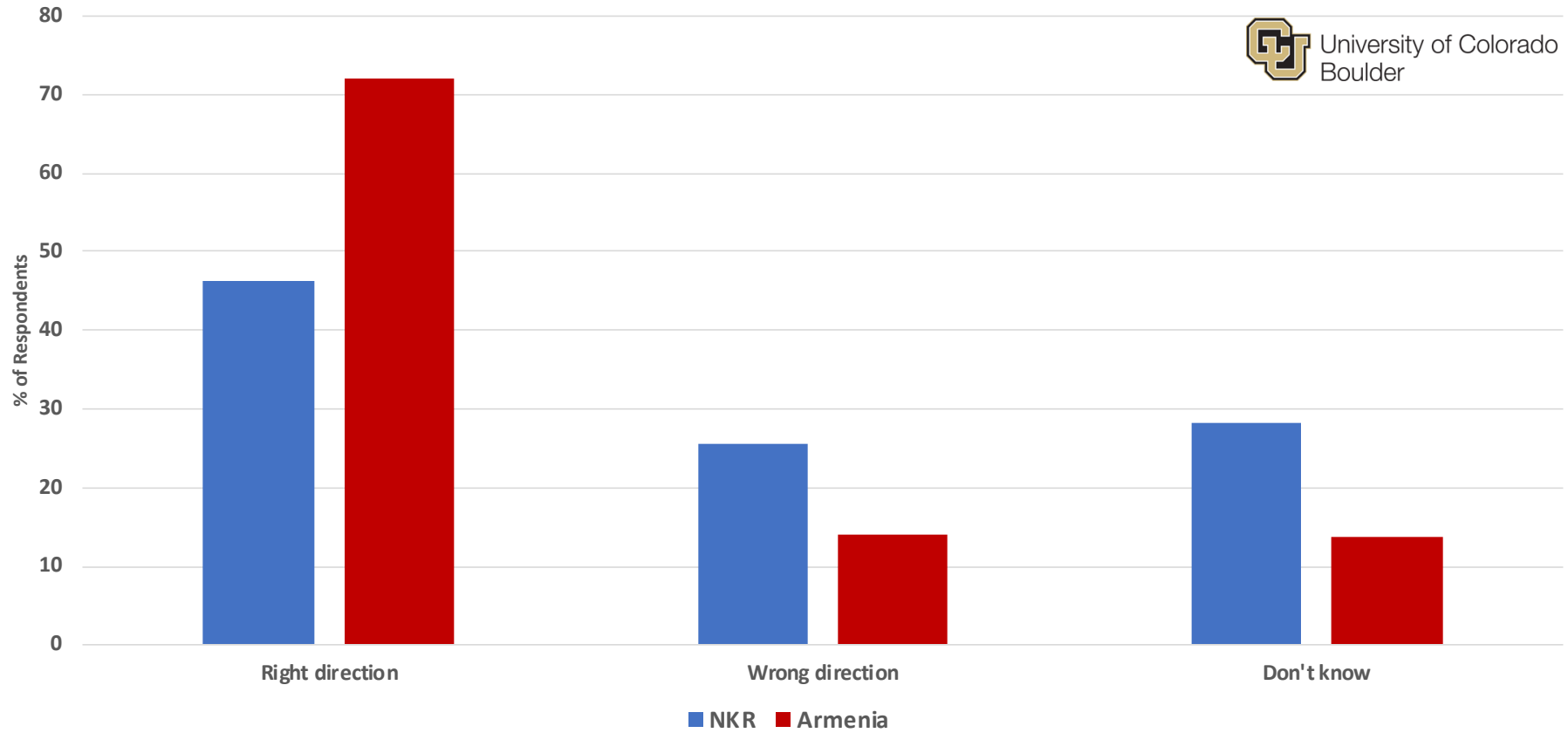
Who was responsible for the 4 day war, April 2016



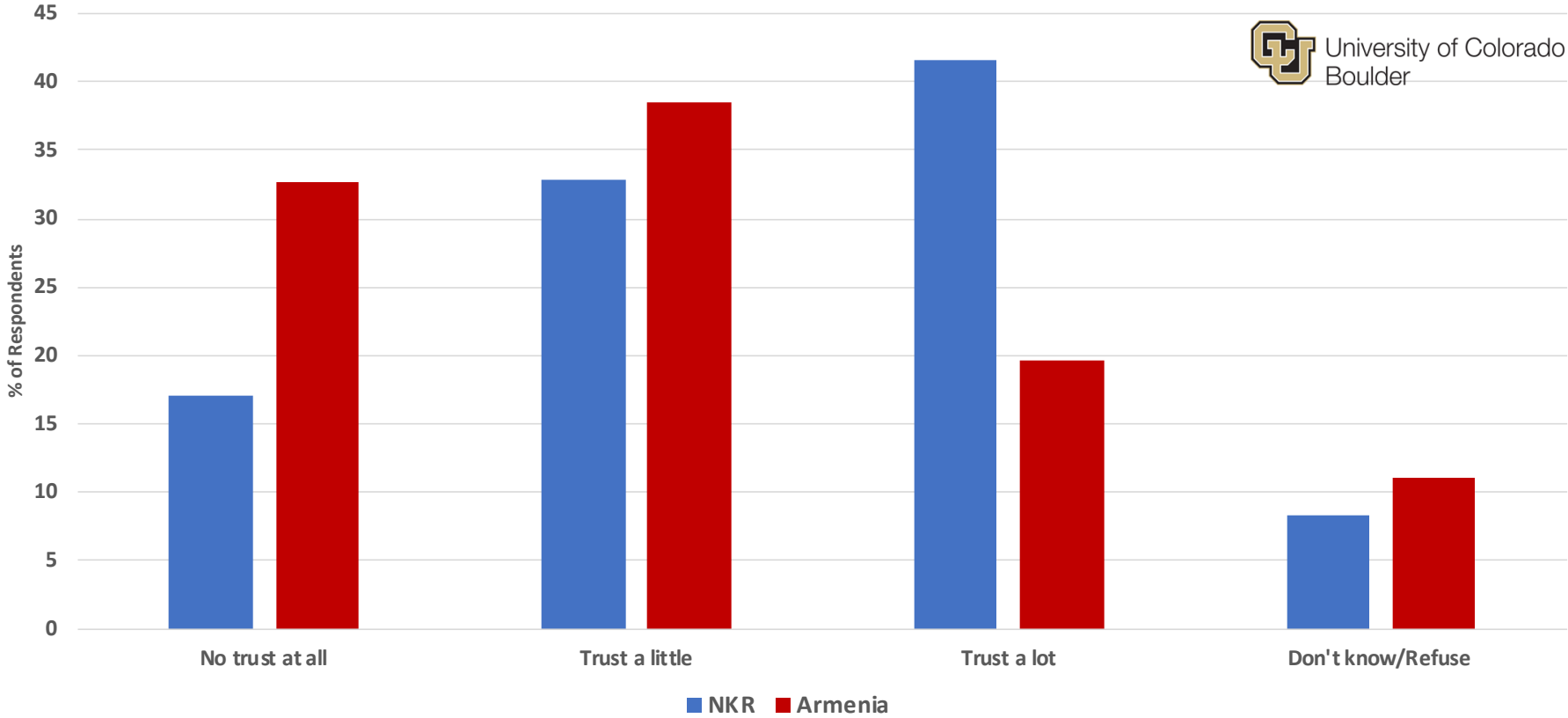
Agreement with Pashinyan call for unification between Armenia and NKR



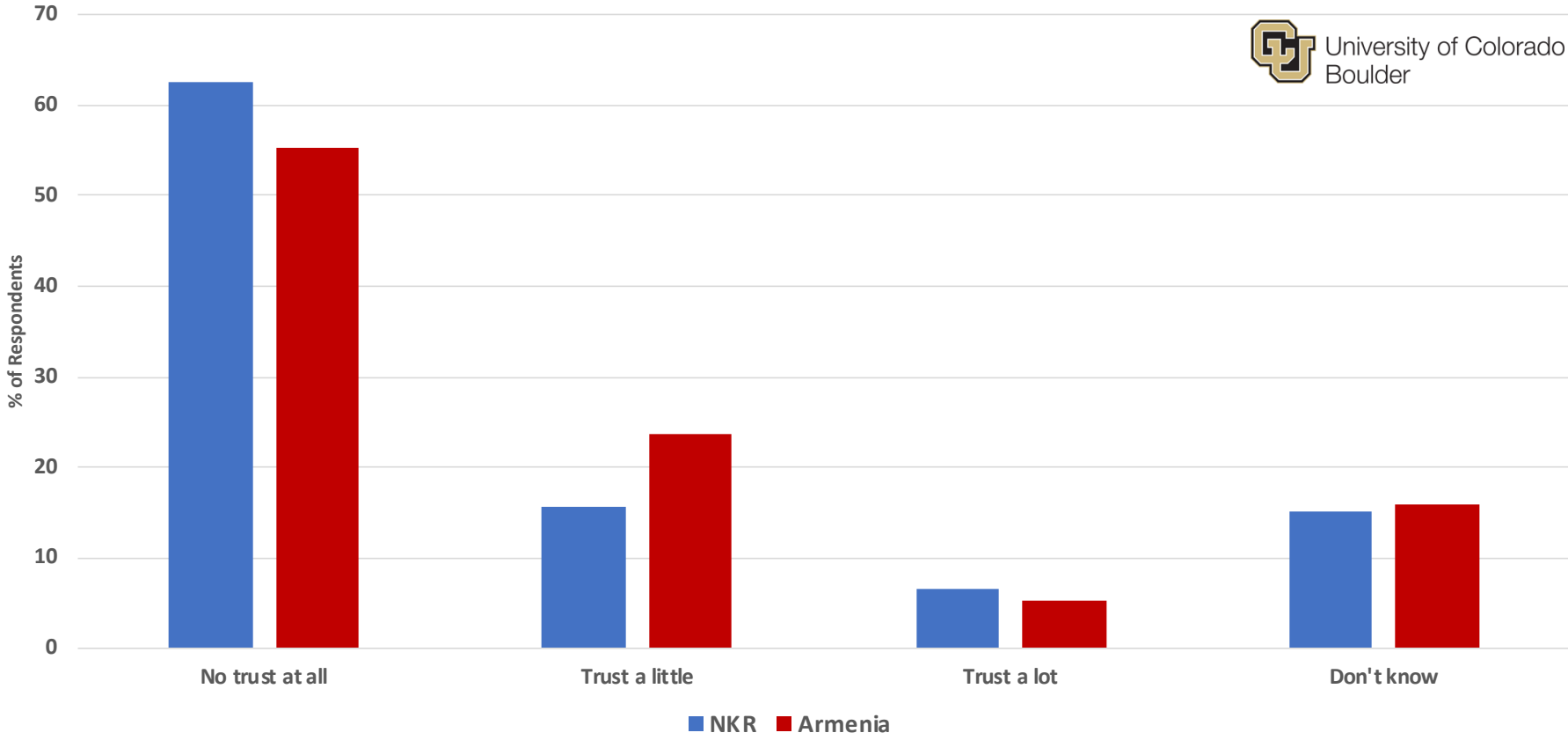
General Direction of the Republic, February 2020
